This exhibit celebrates the artists' and designers' unwavering dedication to their work and practice.

From Lucas T. McMahon's mixed media landscapes evoking loneliness and aloneness, to a reckoning and embrace of identity in works by Steve Riederer and Jesse Ryan Crosby, to those who have pivoted their careers from their original field of study and launched thriving businesses, the exhibit embodies the vast range of artistic expression and creative growth of RMCAD alumni in the waves of the post-academic ocean.

My painting practice is driven by fascination and curiosity. I become captivated by something, usually from my lifelong interests of science fiction, nature, oddities, and storytelling. Skeletons and plants are endlessly explorable to me because of their different embodiments of beauty. They also represent the perpetuating cycle of life and death. Rather than humans, I usually prefer painting subjects that dodge the weight and preconceptions of race, gender, and other factors that can divide or group us. This allows the work to be interpreted more universally. Overall, the goal of my artwork is to haunt you, to give you the feeling of a stirring poem, song, or horror movie.

After graduating Rmcad in December 2009, I enrolled at MSU Denver to earn my K-12 art teaching license. The 2013-2014 school year was my first full-time teaching job and since then I've taught middle school and high school art. I currently teach art at Mountain Range High School in Westminster, Colorado.

Since graduating, it's been important to me to pursue my own art practice and to participate in the vibrant Denver arts community. Until recently I mostly focused on acrylic and watercolor painting, showing my work as a member at Next gallery for nine years. In 2021, I decided to pivot towards writing, illustrating, and publishing my own comics. I have started two series: Sentience, an ongoing science fiction robot story, and Distortion, a solo anthology of comics, poetry, and illustration. Their work has been published domestically and internationally, with recent features in Fifth Wheel Press, The Alchemy Experiments "It'll Be Alright," in Glasgow, UK, University of Baltimore's Literary Journal, Welter, Float Magazine, and several other digital and physical publications.

Lucas T. McMahon 2014 | Fine Arts

Lucas T. McMahon is a visual artist living and working in Denver, Colorado. In 2014 he received his BFA in Painting from Rocky Mountain College of Art + Design. His work was featured in New American Paintings, # 114. He currently works as the 3D Studios Assistant at RMCAD.

I create serene deserts and desolate gardens, often haunted by lonesome subjects isolated within these environs. These scenes have been called both enigmatic and dour. These works explore ideas of fear, uncertainty, and separation, as well as our relationship to others and our surroundings. They are meditations on time and transformation, encapsulated in stillness.

In the work Passages, five clay tablets are each framed in wood with a white backdrop. The tablets depict singular objects rendered in low relief. Each object sits solitary in a unique landscape. They are within the landscape but not a part of it, they levitate, heavy and ethereal. The tablets are shaped like tombstones or arched windows. They wait, indeterminable for how long or how long for. The objects study the viewer.

Throughout this timeline my design career has included everything from visually supporting small local businesses to creating full campaigns for major studio films with too many varying experiences and roles to summarize.

Simultaneously, my fine art career has taken me from small local galleries, to the depths of NYC subway tunnels, to the fairs of Art Basel Miami, to showing around the world amidst a sea of adventure. Currently I am enjoying my new-ish venture of mixing my art, illustration, and design work into silkscreen posters for bands. I also enjoy being the creative director for a brewery in Lake Tahoe and continuing design and animation work for a digital agency in Berkeley, CA. I am always taking on small projects for friends as desired, or time allows. My fine art is a steady constant and I recently moved into a new studio space back home in SF.

The idea for this came from the concept of being "in the closet" and the inherent difficulty of putting gender into clean cut boxes. I wanted to reflect on the limitations of societal norms and expectations, and to embrace the beauty of authenticity. In a society that often pressures us to conform to narrow definitions of gender, this is a small reminder that true liberation comes from accepting our true selves, and that is no small feat.
